Unduplicated Summer 2024 Headcount








Summer 2024 FTE











Age Distribution





Summer 2024 Enrollment Gains

- Demographic shift by students who saw a need for continued education/leveling up
- Disciplined approach to an integrated marketing/strategic student communication plan (IMC) where students were reminded of important registration dates, missing documents, financial/residency holds and payment deadlines
- Process improvements to mitigate barriers
- Financial threshold was increased to \$315 from \$101 (average cost per course)
- Growth in our Dual Enrollment subpopulation representing 10% of our total enrollment





Future Directions for Enrollment Growth

- Expand the embedded advisor program to all Palm Beach County high schools
- Shift the focus of college recruiters to the adult learner
- Use the Call Center to include outbound calls supporting a concierge approach to enrollment
- Expand Trade Up Caribbean connection program and our PBSC on-line in international markets
- Create English Language institute (i.e., athletes)
- Offer more Trade and Industry programs in Spanish and Creole
- Grow our baccalaureate programs and target our AA graduates

State Insurance Update

- Florida Statute 110.123 The Florida College Systems were included in the state group insurance program.
- •IT, HR, and Payroll are working with People First for September's complete file. Ahead of schedule with test files.
- •Utilizing the cost calculator provided by the Department of Management Services, our local 2024-25 cost estimate based on expected migration with a current participant count of 1,070 is approximately \$5.7 million.
- •The Florida College System eligible employees will now receive the same benefits as other state agencies and universities.
- •The Department of Management Services manages the benefits platform for all state-offered benefits.
- People First is the platform all eligible state employees utilize to sign up for benefits.
- The most widely utilized and costly benefit (Medical) will significantly impact employee premiums and out-of-pocket expenses.
- •Other ancillary benefits on the state insurance plan may be more costly. Medical premiums and out-of-pocket expenses should more than offset any of these additional fees.

Financial Aid Investigation Update

- On July 3, 2024, the IT Security team was alerted by the Registrar's office about five possible fraudulent student accounts.
- . The investigation later revealed a total of 82 accounts, with financial aid fraudulently awarded.
- . A total of \$223,082 in financial aid was distributed, with \$162,874.72 directly disbursed and \$60,207.28 to the College.





Financial Aid Investigation Update

- . All identified fraudulent accounts were disabled by July 31, 2024.
- The IP addresses involved in the fraudulent activity were blocked.
- The IT Security team notified the FBI and local law enforcement and are in communication.
- A College task force was formed to review and enhance the application process to prevent future incidents.

Liquidated Damages

What is a liquidated damages clause?

A liquidated damages clause is a provision that specifies a predetermined amount of money a party must pay if the party breaches the contract.





Enforceability of Liquidated Damages Clause

- Courts have consistently denied to enforce liquidated damages clauses when they are deemed punitive, unreasonable, and/or are not based on relevant factors.
- In addition to analyzing the relevant factors, liquidated damages clauses have been ruled enforceable if the assessment is not strictly a penalty, and the assessment of actual damages at the time of entering into the contract was uncertain.





Factors in Determining Enforceability of Liquidated Damages Clauses

- Nature of the contract;
- Terms and purpose of the entire agreement;
- Circumstances surrounding the execution of the contract;
- Natural/ordinary consequence of a breach; and
- Specific circumstances surrounding each case.





Current Policy inconsistent with Case Law

The current Policy contains the following Liquidated Damages Schedule:

Contract Sum Liquidated Damages:

\$00 to \$100,000 \$150 per day

\$100,001 to \$250,000 \$200 per day

\$250,001 to \$500,000 \$300 per day

\$500,001 to \$1,000,000 \$400 per day

\$1,000,001 to \$2,500,000 \$500 per day

\$2,500,001 and over \$600 per day

The policy does not consider any of the relevant factors previously mentioned and is simply a flat rate fee schedule which could potentially be construed as punitive.

6Hx-18-1.00:

- Removal of repealed legal authority.
- Amended to remove outdated language.
- Recommends that policies 6Hx-18-1:01 and 6Hx-18- 1:04 be merged with 6Hx-18-1.00 to streamline the indexation of Section 1 of the DBOT policy.

6Hx-18-1.02:

- Removal of repealed legal authority and simplification of language.
- Clarification of types of meetings (i.e. Special, Emergency, Workshop, etc.).
- Allows Trustees to participate virtually and count towards a quorum.
- Allows Trustees to vote virtually.
- Allows for amending of the Agenda after publishing.
- Provides discretion to discuss items not on the Agenda if it is in the best interest of the College.

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Summary Continued

6Hx-18-1.041:

- Removal of repealed legal authority.
- Delegates the college administration the authority to make "minor amendments or minor substantive changes" to policies without formal presentation to the DBOT for approval.
 - 1.041 defines minor amendments as editorial changes that do not otherwise affect the policy content or substance, such as for the purpose of reflecting changes in various types of policy provisions, including without limitation organizational structure, position or office titles, dates, information technology-based systems, contact names and information, references to laws, rules or policies, renumbering/reorganization of policies; and to correct grammar, punctuation, or clerical errors; or to conform to other Board policies in any other non-substantive ways.

Compliance: Institutional Gen Ed Review

In January 2024, the State Board of Education (SBOE) approved revisions to Rule 6A-14.0303, Florida Administrative Code which set forth the statutory requirements for all general education courses, identified the list of GenEd Core courses beginning fall 2024; and provided institutional requirements for approving and reporting institutional GenEd course offerings.

In accordance with statutory requirements from Sections (ss.) 1007.25 and 1007.55, Florida Statutes (F.S.), all public postse condary institutions must annually review their general education course offerings to ensure compliance with content, principles and standards required for general education courses in the State of Florida.
