Summary:

Background/Pertinent Facts: FAU subleased a portion of its Boca Raton Campus to PBSC in 1982. With the approval of the Fourth Amendment, that sublease will be extended through January 21, 2073. The Addendum to the Sublease with FAU memorializes the terms of the extension and related services as deemed appropriate by the administration.

Financial Impact: The College will compensate the Florida Atlantic University for services provided in connection with the sublease (i.e., police, utilities, and library services) and will be responsible for proportionate concurrency impacts related to planned development.

- Prorated cost of stormwater assessed as of June 1, 2022, at \$1,107 per month.
- Library services \$140,000 annually for the periods July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, July 1, 2023, through June 30, 2024, and July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025, and increased by 3% per year annually thereafter.
- Police/security services \$80,000 for the period July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, \$85,000 for the period July 1, 2023, through June 30, 2024, and \$90,000 for the period July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025, and increased by 3% per year annually thereafter.

Strategic Goal(s) Addressed: TRANSFORMATIONAL - Streamline the Transfer Process Simplify the students' transition to a 4-year degree by strengthening our partnerships with external and internal Bachelor programming.

Duration of Contract: Through the amended Lease Term.

ADDENDUM TO SUBLEASE

This Addendum to Sublease ("Addendum"), dated as of ______, 2023 is by and between the Florida Atlantic University Board of Trustees ("FAU") and Palm Beach State College Board of Trustees ("PBSC").

WHEREAS, FAU and PBSC are parties to Sublease Agreement No. 2724-003, as amended (the "Sublease") for the use of state lands by PBSC for a PBSC South Campus ("PBSC Campus") on FAU's Boca Raton Campus; and

WHEREAS, PBSC contemplates certain capital improvements on the PBSC Campus that will have certain impacts to FAU and to the City of Boca Raton; and

WHEREAS, PBSC and FAU desire to agree to certain arrangements and stipulations with regards to any PBSC improvements and current and future utility impacts; and

WHEREAS, FAU provides certain police/security and library services to the PBSC Campus, as more fully detailed in that certain Agreement for Services dated June 30, 2008, as amended and supplemented (the "Agreement for Services"); and

WHEREAS, PBSC has granted FAU a non-exclusive license to utilize certain parking areas of the PBSC Campus for overflow parking during FAU football games and other FAU stadium events, as more fully detailed in that certain Parking License Agreement dated October 4, 2011, as amended and supplemented (the "Parking License Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, FAU and PBSC desire to memorialize the agreements relating to the Sublease and the PBSC Campus as more specifically set forth in this Addendum; and

WHEREAS, all capitalized terms not defined herein shall have their meanings as ascribed in the Sublease, the Agreement for Services and the Parking License Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises contained herein and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

1. PBSC shall consult with FAU on any proposed capital improvements contemplated to the PBSC Campus and seek to incorporate any reasonable change or modification suggested; provided, however, that PBSC shall obtain the written approval of FAU with regards to any improvements that impact or connect with FAU infrastructure.

2. PBSC shall be responsible for its proportionate share of all concurrency impacts to the City of Boca Raton or other applicable authorities and shall not be entitled to use any concurrency reservations already paid, held, or reserved by FAU. Concurrency impacts shall include without limitation, Palm Tran services and other transportation impacts, fire rescue services, stormwater, solid waste etc.

3. PBSC shall be responsible to FAU for its proportionate share of all utility costs and impacts associated with any existing and future improvements, including but not limited to gas and electric service, installation of new lines, water and sewer, repair or replacement of meters, maintenance and operations of the applicable lift station (based on discharge), PBSC shall be responsible for its prorated cost of storm water based on their impervious area (assessed as of June 1,

2022 at \$1,107 per month). FAU shall invoice PBSC for its proportionate share of such charges and PBSC shall pay such invoices to FAU within 30 days. PBSC shall coordinate the need for any new or modified utility or other easements with FAU and the Florida Division of State Lands.

4. Library services as set forth in the Agreement for Services shall be \$140,000 annually for the periods July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023, July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024, and July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025 and shall be increased by 3% per year annually thereafter. The parties agree to meet at least every five (5) years to discuss the fees for library services and adjust such fees as reasonably appropriate. PBSC staff and student vehicles displaying a PBSC parking decal may park in the FAU parking garage adjacent to the FAU library at no additional cost while using the FAU library. All other parking locations on FAU's campus or any vehicle without a PBSC parking decal shall be subject to FAU parking fees.

5. Police/security services as set forth in the Agreement for Services shall be \$80,000 for the period July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023, \$85,000 for the period July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024, and \$90,000 for the period July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025 and shall be increased by 3% per year annually thereafter. The parties agree to meet at least every five (5) years to discuss the fees for police/security services and adjust such fees as reasonably appropriate.

6. The Parking License Agreement shall remain in full force and effect. PBSC shall consult with FAU on any proposed termination and/or work with FAU on reasonable modifications and/or a reasonable alternative location on the PBSC Campus parking lots to accommodate overflow parking for stadium events.

7. PBSC shall have an emergency management plan that addresses the shared campus of FAU and PBSC. The emergency management plan must address how coordination is executed between PBSC and FAU. The plan shall be submitted to the FAU Department of Emergency Management and updated and reshared as needed. PBSC shall communicate and coordinate directly with the FAU Department of Emergency Management in advance regarding any emergency drill, training, or exercise that is planned to occur on the shared campus of FAU and PBSC.

8. If FAU identifies potential development plans for an undeveloped portion of the PBSC Campus, PBSC agrees to work with FAU to evaluate and discuss potential comparable alternative or relocated property options to consider a swap or other arrangement to reasonably accommodate both FAU and PBSC needs and to cooperate with regards to the process for any such required approvals.

9. Except as specifically modified by this Addendum, all other provisions of the Sublease, the Agreement for Services, and the Parking License Agreement shall remain in full force and effect and shall be binding upon the parties in accordance with their terms.

10. This Addendum may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall constitute an original and all of which together shall constitute but one and the same original document.

Summary:

Background/Pertinent Facts: On April 12, 2022, the District Board of Trustees approved a 4-year contract with TeamDynamix (see MT#4653). The Information Services Department is requesting approval for a contract amendment to add a Conversational AI site License. The original contract amount is \$717,200, and the Amendment will increase the contract amount by \$169,727 for a total contract amount of \$886,927.

TeamDynamix is the tool used by the entire organization for IT and Enterprise Service Management, Project Portfolio Management, and Integration with Process Automation. It is used for reporting and tracking technology incidents, problems with hardware/software/system configurations, service requests, release and change control, asset management, knowledge management, user communication, project intake, project and portfolio management, and collaboration. It is also used to support Enterprise services such as Workday, Facilities, Event Management, CRM, and Instructional Design Technology.

TeamDynamix has recruited Palm Beach State College to be a partner in the development of their new conversational AI chatbot product. This will replace an existing product at the College and be highly integrated with our current Enterprise Service Management system and knowledge base. It will provide a high-level interface to help address some of the standard issues students face. It will be able to provide them with individualized self-help with these issues. This agreement will provide a site license and cost as much as 5 licenses for our existing product. This will enable us to provide this technology enterprise-wide.

1012.86 Florida College System institution employment equity accountability program.—

(1) Each Florida College System institution shall include in its annual equity update a plan for increasing the representation of women and minorities in senior-level administrative positions and in full-time faculty positions, and for increasing the representation of women and minorities who have attained continuing-contract status. Positions shall be defined in the personnel data element directory of the Department of Education. The plan must include specific measurable goals and objectives, specific strategies and timelines for accomplishing these goals and objectives, and comparable national standards as provided by the Department of Education. The goals and objectives shall be based on meeting or exceeding comparable national standards and shall be reviewed and recommended by the State Board of Education as appropriate. Such plans shall be maintained until appropriate representation has been achieved and maintained for at least 3 consecutive reporting years.

(2)(a) On or before May 1 of each year, each Florida College System institution president shall submit an annual employment accountability plan to the Commissioner of Education and the State Board of Education. The accountability plan must show faculty and administrator employment data according to requirements specified on the federal Equal Employment Opportunity (EE0-6) report.

(b) The plan must show the following information for those positions including, but not limited to:

- 1. Job classification title.
- 2. Gender.
- 3. Ethnicity.
- 4. Appointment status.

5. Salary information. At each Florida College System institution, salary information shall also include the salary ranges in which new hires were employed compared to the salary ranges for employees with comparable experience and qualifications.

6. Other comparative information including, but not limited to, composite information regarding the total number of positions within the particular job title classification for the Florida College System institution by race, gender, and salary range compared to the number of new hires.

7. A statement certifying diversity and balance in the gender and ethnic composition of the selection committee for each vacancy, including a brief description of guidelines used for ensuring balanced and diverse membership on selection and review committees.

(c) The annual employment accountability plan shall also include an analysis and an assessment of the Florida College System institution's attainment of annual goals and of long-range goals for increasing the number of women and minorities in faculty and senior-level administrative positions, and a corrective action plan for addressing underrepresentation.

- (d) Each Florida College System institution's employment accountability plan must also include:
- 1. The requirements for receiving a continuing contract.
- 2. A brief description of the process used to grant continuing-contract status.
- 3. A brief description of the process used to annually apprise each eligible faculty member of progress toward attainment of continuing-contract status.

(3) Florida College System institution presidents and the heads of each major administrative division shall be evaluated annually on the progress made toward meeting the goals and objectives of the Florida College System institution's employment accountability plan.

(a) The Florida College System institution presidents, or the presidents' designees, shall annually evaluate each department chairperson, dean, provost, and vice president in achieving the annual and long-term goals and objectives. A summary of the results of such evaluations shall be reported annually by the Florida College System institution president to the Florida College System institution board of trustees. Annual budget allocations by the Florida College System institution board of trustees for positions and funding must take into consideration these evaluations.

(b) Florida College System institution boards of trustees shall annually evaluate the performance of the Florida College System institution presidents in achieving the annual and long-term goals and objectives. A summary of the results of such evaluations shall be reported to the Commissioner of Education and the State Board of Education as part of the Florida College System institution's annual employment accountability plan, and to the Legislature as part of the annual equity progress report submitted by the State Board of Education.

(4) The State Board of Education shall submit an annual equity progress report to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives on or before January 1 of each year.

(5) Each Florida College System institution shall develop a budgetary incentive plan to support and ensure attainment of the goals developed pursuant to this section. The plan shall specify, at a minimum, how resources shall be allocated to support the achievement of goals and the implementation of strategies in a timely manner. After prior review and approval by the Florida College System institution president and the Florida College System institution board of trustees, the plan shall be submitted as part of the annual employment accountability plan submitted by each Florida College System institution to the State Board of Education.

(6) Subject to available funding, the Legislature shall provide an annual appropriation to the State Board of Education to be allocated to Florida College System institution presidents, faculty, and administrative personnel to further enhance equity initiatives and related priorities that support the mission of colleges and departments in recognition of the attainment of the equity goals and objectives.

1001.64 Florida College System institution boards of trustees; powers and duties.-

(19) Each board of trustees shall appoint, suspend, or remove the president of the Florida College System institution. The board of trustees may appoint a search committee. The board of trustees shall conduct annual evaluations of the president in accordance with rules of the State Board of Education and submit such evaluations to the State Board of Education for review. The evaluation must address the achievement of the performance goals established by the accountability process implemented pursuant to s. 1008.45 and the performance of the president in achieving the annual and long-term goals and objectives established in the Florida College System institution's employment accountability program implemented pursuant to s. 1012.86.

1008.45 Florida College System institution accountability process.-

(1) It is the intent of the Legislature that a management and accountability process be implemented which provides for the systematic, ongoing improvement and assessment of the improvement of the quality and efficiency of the Florida College System institutions. Accordingly, the State Board of Education and the Florida College System institution boards of trustees shall develop and implement an accountability plan to improve and evaluate the instructional and administrative efficiency and effectiveness of the Florida College System. This plan shall be designed in consultation with staff of the Governor and the Legislature and must address the following issues:

(a) Graduation rates of A.A. and A.S. degree-seeking students compared to first-time-enrolled students seeking the associate degree.

(b) Minority student enrollment and retention rates.

(c) Student performance, including student performance in college-level academic skills, mean grade point averages for Florida College System institution A.A. transfer students, and Florida College System institution student performance on state licensure examinations.

- (d) Job placement rates of Florida College System institution career students.
- (e) Student progression by admission status and program.
- (f) Career accountability standards identified in s. 1008.42.

(g) Institutional assessment efforts related to the requirements of s. III in the Criteria for Accreditation of the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.

(h) Other measures approved by the State Board of Education.

(2) The State Board of Education shall submit an annual report, to coincide with the submission of the agency strategic plan required by law, providing the results of initiatives taken during the prior year and the initiatives and related objective performance measures proposed for the next year.

(3) The State Board of Education shall address within the annual evaluation of the performance of the executive director, and the Florida College System institution boards of trustees shall address within the annual evaluation of the presidents, the achievement of the performance goals established by the accountability process.
